
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About the Film

In his heavily research-based practice, artist <u>Simon Denny</u> examines the impact of technological advancements on global economics, society, and politics. Born in New Zealand and based out of Berlin, Denny first rose to prominence at the Venice Biennale in 2015, where his sculptural installations in the Marco Polo airport and a <u>Renaissance</u>-era library utilized the graphic designs used within the NSA to explore issues around mass surveillance and national identity. For recent exhibitions, he has reconfigured board games like <u>Settlers of Catan</u> and <u>The Game of Life</u> to reflect the mythologies and values that underpin the culture of Big Tech.
